The International Business major is designed to provide students with a sound understanding of international business principles and the languages and cultures of other regions that are essential for success in today's global economy. More and more businesses are becoming deeply involved in international activities, both in expanding overseas markets and in competition with foreign companies in their own markets. This international business program enriches students' understanding of the business world and the global environment. The program offers an interdisciplinary approach to the study of international business, drawing on all the functional areas of business, thus creating broadly educated, flexible graduates.

Entry level careers associated with International Business
